

FOLLOW IN MY WAYS

How long do we remember the benevolence of our past which establishes our present blessings? At minimum we forget what God has done, at worst we are shortsighted. God understands the creatures He has made, and one of the most God honoring things we can do is have an active memory.

Moses reminds the people, who are finally walking in the promises bestowed to their fathers, don't forget "the Lord thy God (Deut. 8: 11)." It was by His grace, by His forbearance, by His mercies, by His love, and by His divine protection that the very opportunities of blessings and life exists.

If they actively turned away, think in their own heart that it was by their own design, conventions, cunningness, or willpower. This would be the highest offends to God and personal detriment to their person and community.
