Thought to Remember: For there is one God, and one mediator also between God and men, the man

Christ Jesus. (I Timothy 2: 5)



A mediator is a person who attempts to

help people involved in a conflict come to an agreement: that person is also known as a 'go-between'. As Mediator of the new covenant, Jesus Christ is our Ultimate Go-Between.

We now have access to God through the death, burial and resurrection of His Son.

Our blessings, our praise and our healing are no longer mediated by man. Even more, our prayers are answered, our sins are forgiven and we are heirs to the righteousness of Christ.

No person, then, can block our covenant blessings!
